PUBLIC COMMENTS: Roger Estlack addressed Council on agenda item #11, closing streets and alley way. When this item comes up, he speaks against it because you do not know what the future holds. In the past, there was a request to close a block of 4th Street and Collinson which was approved by Council. Several months later, a house was built behind one of the properties that requested closures and the new property owners had to get an easement to get utilities to their property. In another situation, the EDC was looking at acquiring land along the railroad tracks, behind the vet clinic and Anna Howards land for a possible industrial park since it has rail and utility access. He missed a meeting and at this meeting Bill Cornell requested Orpe Street be closed between his store and West Texas Gas and City Council approved it. That would have been perfect access from Hwy 70 & 287 into the industrial area that is no longer available. We do not know what the future holds, we do not know if we might get a housing developer to come in here. Twenty years ago, we would not have thought someone like Peter Odima would have come in and built all those apartments on a block for his entire life was vacant and fenced in by barbed wire, you just do not know. If you act now and close those streets and alleyways, you are limiting the future growth of the city in that area. It hurts nothing to leave it like it is. Morrison Crump was allowed to build a fence on City property when he asked for a street closure, knowing the City could have him remove it in the future if something was to be built there, and that was okay with him. There was a member on the Council at that time that said the city should never give up its right-of-way or it is easement access ever because you just do not know. If our city began to grow in that direction, that would be a beautiful area for housing.
